

**B. B. Cannon Detachment

On October 14, 1837, a detachment of 365 Cherokees led by B. B. Cannon left Tennessee bound for Indian Territory. This group represented the minority of the Cherokees who supported the Treaty of New Echota and was one of three detachments organized and supervised by the U. S. Government.
